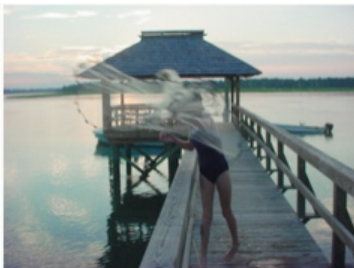

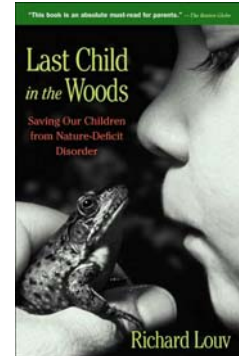

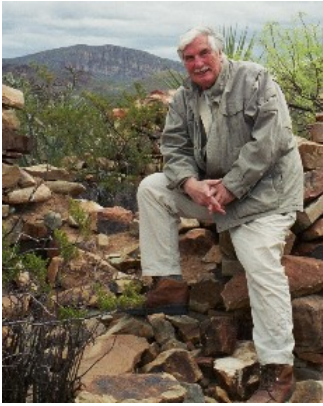

\$5,000 Richard C. Bartlett EE Award

Nominations Due June 30th!



The National Environmental Education Foundation is continuing to accept nominations for the first-ever Richard C. Bartlett Environmental Education Award. This \$5,000 award, made possible by Toyota Motor Sales, Inc., is open to a teacher who has successfully integrated environmental education into everyday teaching.

To be eligible for the Bartlett Award the nominee must be a 5th-12th grade teacher in the United States at a public, private or home school with at least five years of teaching experience. A nomination can come from parents of students, administrators, fellow teachers, students, and self-nominations. The deadline for nomination materials is **June 30, 2007**, and the winner will be notified in September 2007 and honored at the North American Association for Environmental Education conference in Virginia Beach, Virginia, Nov. 13-17, 2007.
